







Lesson Time for 8 Key Learning Areas (KLAs) (S1-S3)







Major Concern 1: To promote the effectiveness of learning and teaching for academic excellence

- 1.1 To enhance students' capacity to excel in academic studies and consolidate an active learning environment in school through self-regulated learning strategies.
- 1.2 To develop students into independent and confident learners with innovative mind and necessary generic skills through application of knowledge, skills and experiences.
- 1.3 To reinforce teachers' competence in the adoption of effective teaching strategies.

Major Concern 2: To nurture TMGSSers' positive values and actions towards personal development, the community and the world

- 2.1 To build up students' self-confidence, self-image and capabilities in setting meaningful life goals.
- 2.2 To strengthen students' perseverance in response to challenges.
- 2.3 To enhance students' understanding of the relationships between Hong Kong, the home country and the world.
- 2.4 To develop students into leaders of tomorrow showing social responsibility.

Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns 2020/2021

Major Concern 1: To promote the effectiveness of learning and teaching for academic excellence

1.1 To enhance students' capacity to excel in academic studies and consolidate an active learning environment in school through self-regulated learning strategies

Achievements

- Note-taking skills were taught and note-making was practised in different subjects. With the acquired skills, students
 were able to organize key learning points by making their own notes in class and at home, which in turn enhanced
 their effectiveness in learning. The notes made according to students' own learning needs were one of the major
 tools in revision and lesson consolidation.
- 2. Self-regulated learning elements had been embedded in junior secondary curricula. With routine training, students' good skills in self-regulated learning were demonstrated in History, Geography and Life & Society lessons. Students fully enjoyed the lessons with self-regulated learning elements and they were more eager to take an active role as independent learners.
- 3. Teachers were keen to share the achievements of applying self-regulated learning on the Staff Development Day. Some good work of students was shown during the sharing session. Through the sharing of pedagogies and strategies concerning the application of self-regulated learning approach in daily teaching routines, teachers' knowledge and skills of conducting lessons with self-regulated learning features were enhanced.
- 4. With ample guidance and training, peer counsellors had given a lot of inspiring quotes and suggestions confidently to S1 students. As a result, they became more responsible, independent and confident peer counsellors who were able to monitor their own learning progress and achieve their learning goals on one hand, and to render prompt assistance to their younger brothers and sisters for the sake of their personal growth on the other.
- 5. Students were nurtured into independent learners with good use of 'My Learning Profile'. They learnt to make more realistic goals, regulate their learning strategies and maintain their progress in studies. Additional support gained from teachers and parents also optimized students' effectiveness to reflect on their goals. Students' learning attitude was hence improved.

Reflection

1. For junior level students attending zoom lessons at home, it was hard for some less able students to concentrate and jot down key points by themselves. The study skills of note-taking could be further sharpened.

2. Adjustments could be made to the self-regulated learning approach to ensure its implementation in case of school suspension to help students develop a more active and independent learning attitude.

1.2 To develop students into independent and confident learners with an innovative mind and necessary generic skills through application of knowledge, skills and experiences

Achievements

- 1. Subject teachers adopted e-learning strategies in lesson preparation and presentation. Google Classroom was used to facilitate teaching and learning since the outbreak of the COVID-19. The use of Zoom and Google Classroom helped enhance the use of e-learning which was effective for both teachers' teaching strategies and students' learning performance.
- 2. Students took part in a great variety of activities outside classroom, including Science, Mathematics, language competitions, debates and gifted programmes. Through participating in these diversified activities, students' exposure was widened. Their knowledge and generic skills were enriched and polished respectively.
- 3. In the Hong Kong School Drama Festival 2020/21, seven students received the Award for Outstanding Performer. Our school also garnered the Award for Outstanding Cooperation and the Award for Commendable Overall Performance. Through taking part in the competitions, our students could polish their communication skills, interpersonal skills, critical thinking skills and problem-solving skills while cultivating their creativity.
- 4. Alumni were invited to join the TMGSS Mentorship Scheme and provided information on further studies and work life to S5 students. The scheme widened the horizons of students and fostered their whole-person development.

Reflection

- 1. More opportunities could be given to students of different levels to stretch their potential.
- 2. To keep providing students with sufficient learning experiences beyond classrooms during the pandemic, ample technical support should be given to students when those activities or competitions are conducted online.

1.3 To reinforce teachers' competence in the adoption of effective teaching strategies

Achievements

1. Teachers grasped the basic skills of using iPads, Apple pencils and Google Classroom and employed e-learning strategies in lesson preparation and presentation. Students' learning materials were systematically uploaded and organized into different subjects for sharing and downloading. Videos and useful websites were shared among teachers and students to bring about effective learning. Active learners made good use of these materials to learn at their own pace and enrich their knowledge.

- 2. Teachers attended e-learning courses regularly and adopted various platforms, apps and software in their teaching such as Nearpod, Quizlet, Kahoot and Google Classroom. Teachers found the tools useful and effective in enhancing students' learning capability.
- 3. Our school served as the cluster school of the EDB English Learning Circle 2020/21. Lessons were opened and observed among 4 affiliated participating schools. Meanwhile, professional dialogues were conducted with lesson plans and materials were shared among all participating schools. Teachers' teaching skills and strategies were effectively enlightened and sharpened.

Reflection

More sharing sessions and professional dialogues on teaching strategies could be arranged.

Major Concern 2: To nurture TMGSSers' positive values towards personal development, the community and the world

2.1 To build up students' self-confidence, self-image and capabilities in setting meaningful life goals

Achievements

- Despite the social distancing restrictions enforced in the face of COVID-19, with the collective efforts of the
 Principal, parents, teachers, social workers, functional teams concerned and subject departments, students of various
 levels were shown to recognize their capabilities, master realistic goal-setting skills as well as uphold self-worth
 through the regular completion of 'My Learning Profile' and fervent participation in a series of career and life
 planning programmes.
- 2. Multifarious platforms were successfully created to stretch students' potentialities and enrich their life experience. Meanwhile, all the data generated from 'My Learning Profile' were conducive to constructing a learner-centered curriculum and addressing issues of learner diversity.

Reflection

- 1. The practice of engaging students in re-orienting their roles and values along with reaffirming their faith in life via goal-setting at various levels should carry on, especially during the year of battling with COVID-19, so as to reinforce the importance of taking ownership of their lives.
- 2. The data bank generated from 'My Learning Profile' could be fully utilized for teachers to plan lessons and design activities with a view to stretching students' potentialities and broadening their exposure, while a greater variety of platforms could be launched for students of diverse learning styles to actualize themselves as well as foster their affective development.

2.2 To strengthen students' perseverance in response to challenges

Achievements

- 1. The significance of 'positive thinking' was effectively heightened through assorted activities conducted by various functional teams, departments and clubs, where students' mental well-being was significantly uplifted with strengthened peer support under the 'Sharing Culture' successfully cultivated on school campus, as well as a 'positive thinking' mindset instilled in them.
- 2. A vast array of experiential learning programmes was successfully introduced via two dimensions, i.e. 'receptive' and 'productive' modes, to hone students' practical life skills, especially problem-solving and stress management skills, with the aim of strengthening students' willpower to push through adversity.

Reflection

- 1. Peer rapport and the 'Sharing Culture' could further be advocated on school campus as a means to inculcating a 'positive thinking' mindset in students, nurturing students' social and interpersonal skills, and facilitating positive communication between students and various parties.
- 2. More large-scale school programmes could be run to nurture students' social and interpersonal skills, guiding them to reflect on meaning in life, build connections with one another, cultivate positive vibes on school campus and reinforce their mindset to overcome adversity.

2.3 To enhance students' understanding of the relationships between Hong Kong, the home country and the world

Achievements

- Promotion of Basic Law Education and National Security Education was in full swing with elements of the Basic Law well-incorporated into the curricula of Life & Society, Liberal Studies, History, Chinese History, Economics and Geography, while students' awareness of the Basic Law and the National Security Law was aroused after partaking in multi-faceted activities.
- 2. Students' exposure to the latest development of the home country could still be widened through formal curricula of different subjects and multifarious life-wide learning activities, though the 'Mainland Exchange Programme' and the study tours to the Sister Schools were cancelled in light of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 3. Though wide-ranging overseas study tours to different parts of the world, including No.2 High School of East China Normal University (Shanghai), Yufa Middle School (Beijing) and Järvaskolan (Sweden) and Futian Secondary School (Shenzhen) had to be reluctantly called off amid COVID-19, students' global vision was consistently promoted through viewing and insightful discussion of educational videos via Google Classroom of various subjects, including Liberal Studies, Geography, History and Chinese History. Additionally, Chinese and English Debating Team members did broaden their global outlook on life through researching various debate topics from multiple perspectives in daily practices and contests.

Reflection

- 1. Students' awareness of the Constitution, the Basic Law and the National Security Law would be heightened by means of interactive activities, exhibitions and large-scale inter-school programmes.
- 2. More life-wide learning experiences, such as Sister School Scheme, Mainland Exchange Programme for Junior Secondary Students, workshops or talks conducted by the Education Bureau should be arranged once the pandemic was under control, to consolidate students' understanding of the latest development of the home country.
- 3. Global perspectives could be advocated in greater depth both inside and outside classrooms through formal and informal curricula, with assorted overseas study tours re-arranged to facilitate cultural exchange among students.

2.4 To develop students into leaders of tomorrow showing social responsibility

Achievements

- 1. 'One Student, One Post' Scheme was smoothly institutionalized during the period of school resumption to boost students' self-confidence and stretch their leadership potential, while varied OLE activities were effectively run by students themselves via online platforms throughout the school year in spite of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Service learning was highly valued among Senior Form students in particular, to raise their civic consciousness and cultivate their sense of volunteerism. The diversified and enriching learning programme supported students taking Health Management and Social Care (HMSC) to extend their learning in the community, enabling them to conceptualize the knowledge obtained inside classrooms and in turn put theories into practice. The practical hands-on experience definitely enhanced students' sense of contribution and cultivated their social responsibilities.

Reflection

- 1. More emphasis should be placed on brushing up students' computer literacy in order to enable student leaders in particular, to exercise professional judgment on the validity, reliability and accuracy of information in the realm of social media.
- 2. A multitude of service-learning programmes could be launched on a regular basis for more students of various levels and diverse abilities. Meanwhile, platforms could be set up for students during morning assemblies to share their precious volunteering experiences with fellow schoolmates to instill concepts of volunteerism and social responsibilities in them.
